Pastor's Notes

*"Fear no one.... What I say to you in the darkness,
speak in the light; what you hear whispered,
proclaim on the housetops."*

Matthew 10:26, 27

We return to the Gospel of Matthew, which will be the heart of our Liturgy of the Word until late November. Much has happened since we left Matthew's account in late February. Jesus has completed his great teaching to the crowds, which began with the proclamation of the Beatitudes. He has chosen twelve apostles and is preparing them to go out on mission. Today he assures them that, in proclaiming God's good news, they will meet opposition, rejection, and threat of physical harm. Yet he also assures them that *God will be walking at their side*, and that the Spirit will give them the words to speak and the courage to speak them. They cannot allow their mission to be hindered by fear of how others might react. They *must* proclaim the kingdom of God whatever the cost.

Perhaps the greater challenge for us *this* summer is a willingness to listen. Before presuming to know how to bring the Good News to those who suffer the effects of systemic racism, and before presuming we have done all we can, we are challenged to listen to the stories of those whose experiences are radically different than our own. We must be willing to face the ways in which societal structures provide advantages to some and disadvantages to others with little or no relationship to merit or ability. And we must be willing to acknowledge the consequences of these structures on the health, security, and life choices of those who have been forced to expose themselves to the current pandemic in order to feed their families, but whose lack of adequate health care places them at greater risk of contracting or dying from the coronavirus.

Our very act of listening is critical to our mission. We cannot speak in the light until we have listened

to the darkness. We cannot proclaim justice from the housetops until we have heard what people whisper for fear of the consequences of speaking out. But we also must listen to one another. We must refuse to allow ourselves to be politicized for some other purpose – whether supporting or opposing our efforts. We must carefully listen to one another and seek the common ground on which we stand as the One Body of Christ. No one of us has all the answers. Our mission is impossible without the fire of the Spirit, the compassion of Jesus, the strength of God, and our living *in communion*.

Blessings to all in our community who minister as fathers to a younger generation: fathers, stepfathers, grand and great grandfathers, godfathers, male mentors, teachers, coaches, and role models. May those who have lost a father know peace of heart. May those whose relationship with father or child has known brokenness find healing and peace with what can and cannot be mended. May those among us soon to become fathers experience the support of a caring community.

This is my last column for the summer. Follow the weekly Constant Contact for current information as we move through Phase 1/1A of the reopening of our church building and move toward Phase 2. We are blessed with a *great* team of leaders who are guiding us into safe ways to gather in prayer. Please support them with your patience, your affirmation for their efforts, and your generosity of time as a volunteer if you are able. *Stay safe and be well* as we move through this unusual summer with God and one another.

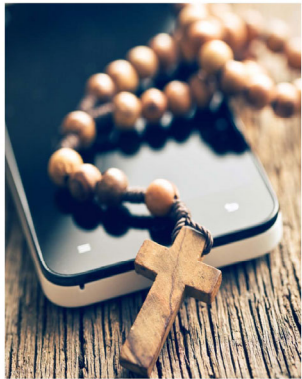

SACRAMENTS AND SERVICES NOW BEING OFFERED DURING PHASE 1/1A

Reconciliation is celebrated on Saturday mornings from 9-10AM in the lower Unity Hall vestibule. Enter from the parking lot through the courtyard between the church and education buildings. While waiting, please observe the outside markings for social distancing and wear a mask. In bad weather, please line up your cars and wait in the car until the prior person leaves the vestibule.

Baptisms. We have begun to celebrate private Baptisms (Phase 1 limit of 10 people in attendance) for both families whose baptisms had been scheduled in March through this Sunday and those who want to schedule a Baptism. Baptisms are scheduled through the parish office at one-hour intervals on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

Marriages. Our next weddings will be celebrated in August. If we still are in Phase 1, weddings will be limited to a maximum of ten people in attendance.

Funeral Masses. We now can celebrate Funeral Masses with a limit of 10 people in attendance during Phase 1. We also can celebrate a Funeral service at the graveside.

Holy Hour of Adoration. The Holy Hour of Adoration on the third Thursday of the month returned last Thursday. During Phase 1/1A, no more than 10 people can be in the church for prayer at any one time. If we remain in Phase 1/1A in July, a reservation system will be provided for those who want to attend.

Private Prayer. The church building reopens this Monday, June 22, for one hour of private prayer, Mondays through Fridays, from 8:30-9:30AM. Again, no more than 10 people can be in the church for prayer at any one time. Go to the parish website to reserve a 30-minute space on any day this week.

Anointing of the Sick. Fr. Bill must refer a request to anoint someone who has tested positive or is suspected of having contracted COVID-19 to one of the priests that have been designated to perform these anointings. Fr. Bill remains available for all other anointings following established safety guidelines. The first step in requesting the Anointing of the Sick is to contact the rectory.

MOVING TO PHASE 2

On June 1, Cardinal Cupich announced that Catholic parishes in Illinois can apply for certification for Phase 2. In Phase 2, parishes can open for Sunday and weekday Mass with a limited attendance (15%-20% of seating capacity). Our Reopening Leadership Team has established two criteria that will determine our move to Phase 2.

- ❖ We have recruited and trained enough volunteers to cover all the required ministries (greeting, set-up, and re-freshen) for each Mass or service that we offer. (We are about half-way to this point.)
- ❖ The Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) recommends that it is safe to do so. The current IDPH directive states, "it is strongly recommended that places of worship continue to facilitate remote services....Even with adherence to social distancing, multiple different households convening in a congregational setting carries a higher risk for widespread transmission of the virus that causes COVID-19, and may result in increased rates of infection, hospitalization, and death, especially among vulnerable populations."

By early July, we hope to have trained enough volunteers and to have a revised recommendation from the IDPH. We are in the process of developing a revised interim weekend Mass schedule that allows time to dismiss participants from one service, restore the space, and greet and seat people for the next service. We will have a reservation system in place so that people will know in advance whether they can attend a given Mass. Stay tuned for details.

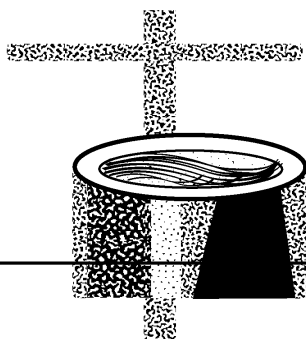




