

Scripture Reflections

It is so easy for us to be consumed by activities, checking boxes, crossing items off lists. There can be a great satisfaction in acting this way and a tremendous sense of accomplishment. But we hear a different message with other priorities today. Rather than busy ourselves or stir ourselves into a frenzy, it is the proper role of a disciple to listen to Jesus' instruction. And this does not mean become a priest or sister. Instead, it can mean to spend time in prayer, or with Scripture, coming to know the person of Jesus in a better way. This activity is critical for any disciple. And the example we have today is that of a woman. Luke is clear in presenting Jesus as giving pride of place to the disciple who listens to his instruction. Let us go and do the same.

Cardinal Cupich Visits Auschwitz

ABC 7 Chicago Eyewitness News presents: RETURN TO AUSCHWITZ: A SURVIVOR'S STORY reported from Auschwitz by Alan Krashesky in a half-hour news special this Sunday, July 21 at 10:30 pm.

Fritzie Fritzshall was only 13 years-old when she was forced to leave her home in Czechoslovakia for the notorious concentration camp, Auschwitz. She had no idea of the unimaginable horrors she'd face or how she would narrowly escape death on more than one occasion. Fritzshall, now President of the Illinois Holocaust Museum and Education Center in Skokie, Illinois, revisits the death camp for the final time, over the objections of her family, fearful of its emotional toll.

Alan Krashesky captures Fritzshall's riveting and heartwrenching story as she recounts what happened to her, her family and friends there. Cardinal Blase Cupich, who became friends with Fritzshall through his work with the museum, joined her for support.

Cardinal Blase Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, said, "With the rise of, once again, anti-Semitism, whether it's in rhetoric or it's in acts, it's important for us to come together as a society and take a stand and say 'this is not tolerable."

Fiscal Year Report of Collections from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019

Total Collections for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019:	\$1,842,411
Budget:	\$1,900,000

Our fiscal year offertory increased 1% over last year's, short of our <u>budgeted</u> increase of 4% to break even. In the upcoming months we will provide more information about how this affects our financial position.

We are in the process of revising our budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year, which began July 1st. Until this has been finalized and reviewed by the Finance Council in early September, we will not be reporting actual collections versus budget.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process of spiritual and educational formation through which adults become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church.

Who participates in RCIA?

- **1. Unbaptized Adults** who are feeling called to become followers of Christ by receiving the Sacraments of Initiation Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
- 2. Adults Baptized as Christians in another denomination, who are now interested in living out their Christian life in the Catholic Church. They are welcomed into full communion through a profession of faith and receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.
- 3. Adults Baptized Catholic who are seeking to complete their sacraments of initiation with the celebration of Confirmation and Eucharist.

Thomas Berry (1914–2009) was one of the 20th Century's most profound and forward-thinking "geologians", who sought to replace the modern alienation from nature with a sense of intimacy and responsibility. Mary Evelyn Tucker and John Grim teach at Yale University, where they direct the Forum on Religion and Ecology. They knew Thomas Berry well, edited his books, and co-authored the first biography of this great man. Cost: \$20 (the book will be available at this program).

Christian Meditation at St. John of the Cross

Christian Meditation is a contemplative spiritual discipline which is similar to Centering Prayer, or sometimes referred to as "prayer of the heart". This prayer is not new—for centuries it had been lost in our Catholic faith, especially for lay people; but is for all who want to live more fully in the Spirit of God.

How To Meditate

Sit still and upright in a quiet place with feet flat on the floor and hands in lap or on knees.

Let go of any expectations or demands. Just Be.

Gently close your eyes and silently, interiorly begin to say a single prayer word. The word recommended is Ma-ra-na-tha (Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke), meaning "Come, Lord".

Continue repeating the word during the entire time of meditation. Whenever distractions come, gently return your attention to the word, without judging or analyzing. It is recommended to meditate 20-30 minutes twice a day.

Words from some of the meditators:

"After meditating for some time I began noticing subtle, yet very real changes in the way I was feeling and responding to life situations—more open, peaceful, compassionate, and less reactive. Being part of a group at SJC helps me to be more faithful to the daily practice."

"Something which keeps me going with meditation is the knowledge that the important thing is to be faithful to the practice. Our God wants us all to be in closer union with Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Meditation is a way for me to seek that union, and a great thing about it is that anyone can do it."

All are welcome to any of the 4 weekly groups for Christian Meditation in the Parish Center, Room 7. Meetings last 45 to 55 minutes, and no experience is necessary.
