Scripture Reflections

A relationship with Christ is not an insurance policy whereby we pay our premiums and expect to receive a settlement when needed. This relationship with the Son of God is not so transactional that we do x, y, and z and Jesus in return grants salvation. If such were the case we would be effectively earning our own salvation by our works. But salvation is a free gift undeserved, no matter how much we might feel we deserve it. The master locks the door on the evildoers barring entry to them. The frightening thing is that some of those locked out know the Lord. Would they consider themselves evildoers? Not likely. Where are we in this story? Are we striving to enter through the narrow door? Are we waiting until later before we make up our minds? When will the door be shut, not in some apocalyptic sense, but when we come to the end of our own personal life? There will be a reversal of fortune. Let us be prepared and manage our expectations lest we be disappointed.

Quest Confirmation Parent/Teen Meeting



ICP's mission is to maximize the independence and well-being of older adults by enabling connections with others in their community. ICP is a non-profit organization that works together with volunteers to provide rides to older adults in the Lyons Township, south Proviso and Riverside townships. Over 115 volunteers provide accompanied transportation to medical appointments, and life-enhancing errands such as the grocery store, hairdresser, bank, and church.

In 1999, extensive community research undertaken by Community Memorial Foundation identified the plight of isolated adults in our communities. ICP was founded with grants from the Community Memorial Foundation and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (Faith in Action). Seven local congregations, including SFX, formed Interfaith Community Partners to better meet the needs of older adults in the Greater Lyons Township. ICP began as a visitation service with teams of volunteers from the seven founding churches. It became evident that loss of mobility is one of the biggest causes of isolation.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process of spiritual and educational formation through which adults become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church.

What Is Involved? When Does It Start?

RCIA is comprised of 4 stages, each with a different focus, and a ritual to mark the transition.

- 1. Our journey begins Tuesday, September 17 with the **Inquiry** period. We will meet weekly, Tuesday nights from 7:00-8:30 pm, to reflect upon how God is calling us and what it means to have faith in Jesus. There is plenty of time to ask questions and decide if this is the right step for you. Early in December, we celebrate the **Rite of Acceptance and Welcome** at a Sunday Mass, which publicly marks our desire to enter formation into the Church.
- 2. Next is the **Catechumenate** period. Here we reflect on Scripture, and delve into Catholic beliefs, teachings, customs and traditions. To end this period, we celebrate another ritual: the **Rite of Election**. That Rite recognizes our progress of being formed in the faith and affirms our readiness to begin final preparations for receiving the sacraments.
- 3. The third period, **Enlightenment**, begins when Lent begins, on February 26, and includes gathering for Mass over the weekend. This period is reflective and prayerful, including special celebrations and rituals passed down from the early Church. We **Celebrate the Sacraments** and our full initiation into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil Service after sundown on Holy Saturday, April 11, the evening before Easter Sunday
- 4. The final period, called **Mystagogy**, is not the end, but rather the beginning of your life as a fully initiated disciple! We will gather a few times during the Easter Season (the 50 days after Easter) to help launch us into the next step of our faith journey and the rest of our lives as Catholic disciples of Christ.


