

Pastor's Notes

Be doers of the word and not hearers only.

James 1:22

In case you missed the challenge of St. Paul last week to, "Live in love, as Christ loved us," St. James insists that it is love in action that distinguishes the Christian community. We gather each weekend in sacred ritual to be reformed, nourished, and sent in Word and Sacrament. In the Eucharist, Christ becomes part of us, physically and spiritually, and joins us as one body in him. But our sacred rituals and our spoken and sung prayers are worse than empty if we leave them behind when we go out into the world of our daily living.

Last weekend, I spoke of the need for the love of Christ must be heard by others in our words and deeds. Too many have heard harsh words that have led to fear or anger, and a sense that the church has nothing to offer them. Young people can be especially quick to notice and point out when our actions do not reflect our words. It is important for us to acknowledge our failures to love as Christ loved, to be accepting of one another, and to devote our lives to the service of the last and the least among us.

It is equally important for us not to hide our light under a bushel basket and to let our good deeds go unseen. Our best preaching is when we are seen reaching out to others. It may be a word of compassion or understanding when another is being difficult. It may be seeking forgiveness when we realize we were in the wrong, or freely extending that forgiveness to another, even when they refuse to acknowledge their wrong. It is providing food every Tuesday for local families in need. It is bringing communion to those unable to be with us each Sunday. It is greeting each person at the doors of church and especially welcoming the newcomer to our gathering. It is efforts such as "This Man is You" that provide an opportunity for men to deepen their faith with one another, and those who share their time and talent to support parents as the primary teachers of their children in the ways of faith.

Our mission is to love as Christ loved and so be the face of the church to family, friends, and this community. Our mission is to be doers of the word in our everyday words and actions. Our mission, as put into words by our recent ancestors in faith, is to:

wholeheartedly live and celebrate the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We commit ourselves to live in communion with God, others, and all of creation to create a more just world through sacraments and worship, learning, and service.

May we do as we profess and invite others to join us on this journey of faith.

Weekend Mass Updates at St. Francis Xavier!

The CDC recently revised its recommendations on wearing masks in indoor, public spaces, following evidence that the COVID delta strain can spread rapidly even among fully vaccinated individuals. The parish Leadership Reopening Team met this week to determine how to respond and provide the safest possible environment for all who worship at St. Francis Xavier. As a rule, we intend to avoid sudden changes to our protocols that might stir confusion or concern among worshippers.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are **now in effect**.

- Masks are <u>required for everyone</u> over age 2, regardless of vaccination status.
- We invite everyone to sing with your mask in place! Pick up a bulletin as you enter church for the words to the hymns. As you leave, place any bulletins you are not taking home in the recycle baskets at each door.
- Please wait for an usher to invite your pew to come forward for communion. With your mask in place, receive the host in your hand and move six feet to the side before removing your mask to consume the host.

The following protocols remain unchanged.

- All church doors remain open for all worshippers.
- Unity Hall remains open to families with small children to offer a remote viewing option on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM and 11AM. This is only for families with small children and no cold symptoms.
- Every other pew in the back of church and in the east transept is <u>not</u> available for seating. These areas provide social distance for parents with infants, those with immune issues, and those not yet comfortable being closer than six feet. All other pews remain available for general seating.
- Please avoid physical contact with those not of your own household, especially during the Sign of Peace. A nod or a wave is always appropriate.
