Pastor's Notes

"This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

"I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance."

Luke 15:2,7

Many religious authorities in the time when Jesus walked this earth were upset by his teachings and persistently sought ways to discredit him. They seem to have had a special animosity toward his teachings on God's loving mercy. When they named someone a "sinner" they acquired a certain power over that person; others named them as "righteous," whether out of fear or misguided respect. Jesus threatens this "authority" when he forgives sinners and lifts them up. The notion that God rejoices more over a repentant sinner than over the "holy" authorities was something they strongly opposed.

In Luke's gospel, Jesus responds through three parables. A shepherd searches for a lost sheep and carries it on his shoulders back to the fold. A woman diligently searches her home from top to bottom for a lost coin and celebrates when she finds it. A father looks down the road each day in hopes of seeing his wayward son, so that he might celebrate his return home. Whether a lost sheep, a lost coin, or a lost son, the ultimate response is the same: great joy and celebration. Jesus is clear: *God is always seeking us out*, yearning for the opportunity to celebrate our return.

St. Paul sings of God's abundant grace as that which transforms his weakness into a revelation of God's goodness. We need not be pretentious Pharisees who judge others in order to appear righteous. It is precisely when we humbly acknowledge our weakness and sinfulness that we make known the God who loves, forgives, and sends us as instruments of grace for others.

When we celebrate the presence of God's mercy in others, we remember that this same *mercy is always* available to us if we but ask.

Many of you have asked how I am going to make it through this time until Fr. Karol and a new pastoral associate arrive on staff. I appreciate that in this time I will face my limits and be asked to accept humbly the help of God and others. I will have to apologize when conflicting demands or a busy schedule causes me to react rather than to respond; to argue rather than to listen. Without someone to whisper in my ear, I will have to admit my weakness in remembering names, even of those with whom I interact regularly. I always have marveled at those who have the gift of remembering a name after hearing it once. I must acknowledge more humbly that, as my brain ages, it becomes even more difficult to retrieve names that I know that I know. I ask your patience and forgiveness when I call you by the wrong name or need to ask you to tell me your name again. It is not for lack of care; it is a limit of this marvelous but imperfect brain that God gave me.

All is well. All will be well. God is good and forgiving.

These words are <u>not</u> empty platitudes; they express our beliefs. May we repeat them whenever we feel lost, alone, or isolated because of our sins or failings. May we bring the message of God's loving mercy to all others through the humble witness of our lives.

Firearms Restraining Order Making Our Communities Safer

The LaGrange Area League of Women Voters, the LaGrange Area Moms Demand Action, Indivisible Brookfield, Indivisible Western Springs and the St. Francis Xavier Peace and Justice Committee are cosponsoring a free, public program: Illinois Firearms Restraining Order; Making Our Communities Safer, on Wednesday, September 18 from 7:00-8:30 pm. Doors open at 6:30 pm at Lyons Township High School, South Campus Performing Arts Center, 4900 Willow Springs Road, Western Springs. A Question/Answer session will follow the presentations.

Presenters will be from Speak for Safety IL: Mark Jones, retired ATF agent and Community Outreach Coordinator for Law Enforcement Training and Peter Contos, Community Outreach Coordinator for local communities. The Firearms Restraining Order allows a family/household member or local law enforcement to petition for a court order to temporarily remove firearms from an individual exhibiting risky behavior. The program will inform the public about the law and steps to take to file for a court order. It will highlight how the Order has the potential to reduce gun-related suicides and domestic violence incidents.

Thirty members of the co-sponsoring organizations have been interviewing local leaders in eleven surrounding communities: Police Departments, Mental Health Agencies, Schools, Libraries, Churches and Hospitals. The results of the interviews will be shared with the public.

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is a key advisory group to the pastor. The PPC can take various forms, based on how best to gather the "voice" of the parish, live the mission of the parish, and encourage the investment of parish resources in a way that best serves that mission. The current members of the PPC are recommending a new structure to accomplish this in our parish. You are invited to offer feedback on the following proposal at the next Parish Conversation: Monday, September 30, at 7:00 pm.

PROPOSED PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL RENEWED STRUCTURE

Mission Statement

The St. Francis Xavier Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) supports and animates the parish mission as an advisory group to the parish pastor and pastoral staff.

Purpose

The PPC supports, enlivens, and advances the mission of the parish, and serves as a consultative group to the parish pastor and pastoral staff.

The PPC is a sounding-board for the pastor and offers input and advice on various issues that relate to the life and wellbeing of the parish. Issues may be brought to the PPC by the pastor, members of the PPC, or other parishioners. The PPC is drawn from a cross-section of the parish and provides the pastor with a collective wisdom from which he can draw in the exercise of his pastoral leadership of the parish.

Structure and Membership

The PPC is comprised of parishioners of St. Francis Xavier Parish. The PPC can fluctuate between ten and fourteen members, based on what best serves the parish at a given point in time. The PPC meets with the pastor at least nine times each year. Individuals from parish groups or ministries may be invited by the pastor or the PPC to share their insights and perspectives in certain conversations; likewise, a parishioner may ask to be placed on the PPC agenda. In addition, the PPC periodically holds open parish Town Hall meetings to seek parishioner input and feedback. The PPC may form subcommittees to promote progress on larger issues. Approved minutes of PPC meetings are published on the parish website.

Responsibilities and Expectations

PPC members do <u>not</u> represent a specific ministry, constituency, or group within the parish; each member represents the parish <u>overall</u>. The PPC seeks to respect diverse perspectives among PPC members and works toward consensus on issues that require a decision or recommendation. PPC members are expected to be present at all PPC meetings and at all meetings hosted by the PPC (e.g., Town Halls). Members of PPC also make it a priority to attend key parish activities and fundraising events.

Terms of Service and Selection of Members

PPC members serve a two-year term. Each spring the Pastor invites the PPC, parish staff, and <u>all</u> parishioners to suggest candidates. In consultation with the pastoral staff and PPC, the pastor designates new PPC members from among the candidates. If for any reason a member of the PPC cannot complete a term, the pastor consults with the PPC and designates a replacement for the remainder of that member's term.

The pastor and the members of the PPC select a Chairperson from among its members. The Chair serves a two-year term. The Pastor and members of the PPC also designate a vice-chairperson to serve in the absence of the Chair, and a secretary to prepare minutes of all PPC meetings. These officers each also serve a two-year term.

Rotation of Members - Staggered Terms

The PPC will attempt to replace no more than one half its members every two years to provide for continuity for the PPC. Members can ask to serve for a second consecutive term; the Pastor will consult with PPC members to determine what is best for the PPC moving forward. After leaving the PPC, a member must wait at least five years before returning to the PPC. but may return to the Council after an interval of at least five years.




