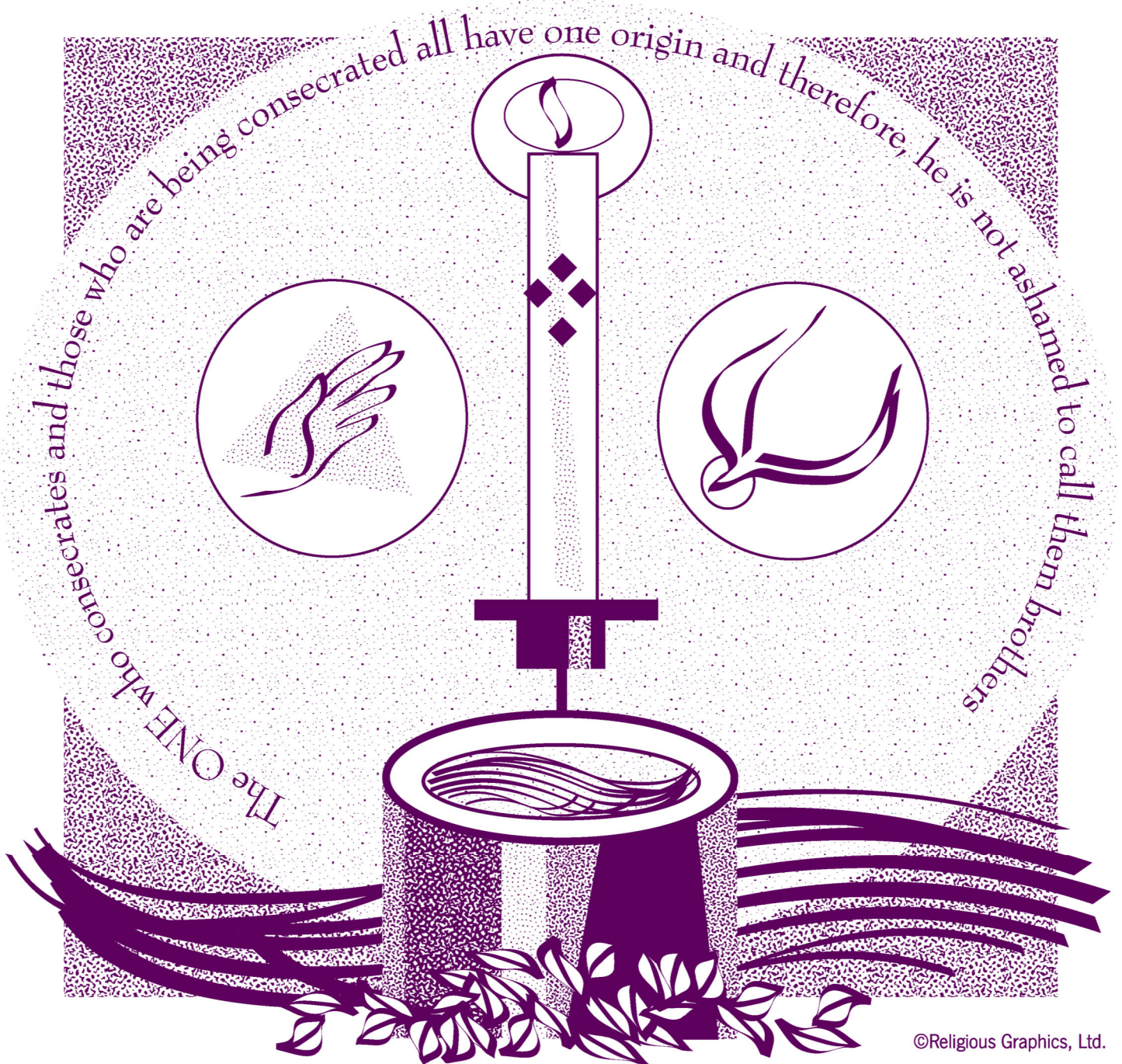

Pastor's Notes

*"Let the children come to me;
do not prevent them."
Mark 10:14*

Children were paid little attention in first Century Israel. Perhaps because of the high child mortality; perhaps because they could not be "productive" during hard times. So, the disciples are sure of themselves as they do a "favor" for Jesus. The day has been long enough; Jesus needs his rest. Or, more likely, they themselves are tired and want people to go home. How often are my own motives less pure than I admit?

Jesus responds to their actions, immediately and clearly. He insists that the children are our teachers. If we are to understand the way to the kingdom of God, we must become their students. A person's worth comes not from any external measure, but from the openness of their heart. The pure joy of a child's laughter, the humble tears of a child's apology; these are the reflections of God's Spirit alive in us.

October is a month that calls us to reflect on the dignity of human life from conception until natural death, especially the lives of the most vulnerable among us. First of all, we advocate for the unborn who have no voice of their own. We pray to change hearts and minds that might discard the unborn even as the first disciples disregarded the children coming to Jesus. We do not presume to know the circumstances under which a woman might consider ending her pregnancy; nor do we, especially us men, presume to know what we might consider when faced with circumstances beyond our imagining. We speak up to give the unborn child a voice in

the conversation. And, we speak with compassion for those among us who are healing from a past decision that now brings them pain.

October is a month that calls us to greater awareness of how to facilitate the needs of those with physical or intellectual disabilities. The church has come a long way in making parish facilities accessible to all. Over the past 30 years, our building projects have increased accessibility to our facilities both outside and inside. Some ask why I sign the Alleluia and Sign of Peace if there are no deaf persons among us. I was taught by an advocate long ago, "If you never show your willingness to sign for the hearing impaired, they may never feel that they are welcome." It is a small gesture of hospitality to the deaf and their family and friends.

Finally, October calls us to greater awareness of domestic abuse in our community and in our extended family. We learn the signs of domestic abuse so that we can offer resources and support to someone who feels trapped and possibly responsible for the abuse they suffer. We refuse to look the other way. We speak up, even if our words are rejected. We advocate for the dignity of each human life.

May we never see any human life as more worthy of dignity and respect. May we be a voice of justice and do what we can to lead all to the loving arms of Jesus.

Weekend Mass Updates at St. Francis Xavier!

The CDC has revised its recommendations on wearing masks in indoor, public spaces, following evidence that the COVID delta strain can spread rapidly even among fully vaccinated individuals. The parish Leadership Reopening Team has determined how we will respond to provide the safest possible environment for all who worship at St. Francis Xavier.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are **now in effect**.

- ◆ **Masks are required for everyone** over age 2, regardless of vaccination status.
- ◆ **We invite everyone to sing with your mask in place!** Pick up a bulletin as you enter church for the words to the hymns. As you leave, place any bulletins you are not taking home in the recycle baskets at each door.
- ◆ Please wait for an usher to invite your pew to come forward for communion. With your mask in place, receive the host in your hand and move six feet to the side before removing your mask to consume the host.

The following protocols remain **unchanged**.

- ◆ **All church doors remain open** for all worshippers.
- ◆ **Unity Hall remains open to families with small children** to offer a remote viewing option on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM and 11AM. This is only for families with small children and no cold symptoms.
- ◆ Every other pew in the back of church and in the east transept is not available for seating. These areas provide social distance for parents with infants, those with immune issues, and those not yet comfortable being closer than six feet. All other pews are available for general seating.
- ◆ Please avoid physical contact with those not of your own household, especially during the **Sign of Peace**. A nod or a wave is always appropriate.


