Pastor's Notes

When you've done everything expected of you, be matter-of-fact and say, "The work is done.

What we were told to do, we did."

Luke 17:10

October has been chosen to raise awareness of several issues that apply to us as disciples in mission. We easily might feel overwhelmed; yet Jesus promises the gifts of the Spirit to allow us to do all we are asked to do. We cannot do everything. Jesus asks us to focus on the tasks God sets before us at this moment, as individuals and as a faith community, and to respond to the best of our Godgiven abilities.

Dignity of the Unborn. How do we advocate for the lives of the unborn without judging or condemning those who choose to end a pregnancy? Catholic morality teaches that directly terminating a life in the womb is never permitted. Yet many of us know of complex situations in which this morally correct teaching is pastorally inadequate. Can we develop an attitude among youth and young adults that reserves consideration of abortion to exceptional circumstances, and only then through a prayerful decision of conscience? Will we create loving and supportive environments and support facilities in which those facing difficult pregnancies will receive what they need in order to choose life?

Protection of the Immigrant. This is deeper than fixing our fractured immigration system or responding to those living in our country without proper documentation. This is an issue of treating <u>each</u> immigrant, with or without documents, and especially family groups and children, with the dignity and respect that every child of God deserves. We are challenged to step beneath the politics that keep our country and our leaders divided, even as we challenge them to talk to one another toward a just solution. Becoming members of God's family makes us members of a <u>world</u> community in which each person deserves to be treated with dignity and respect.

Domestic Violence Outreach. Purple ribbons encourage us to become more aware of the signs and the presence of domestic violence within our families, within our neighborhood, and within our community. Do we know the signs that indicate that someone within a household is being abused: physically, verbally, or emotionally? Are we aware of the resources available to help a family member or friend who is ready to act and step away from an abusive relationship or environment?

Inclusion Awareness. St. Francis Xavier has done much in recent decades to make our facilities accessible to all, regardless of physical or other disability. What barriers continue to keep individuals out? What more is there for us to do?

Reducing Gun Violence. How do we advocate for reasonable limits on access to weapons or the weapons themselves? How can we make our communities safer for children and youth, especially in more impoverished areas of the greater Chicago area?

Groups in the parish or the area are focused on all the above. If one of these areas interest you, contact the parish office for more information.

October Count. On the four Sundays of October, all Archdiocesan parishes count the number of people at each weekend Mass. This helps the Archdiocese better understand current trends and plan moving forward. Please make the effort to join us for weekend worship and proclaim one measure of who we are as St. Francis Xavier Parish.

Come for Eucharistic Adoration October 17 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. "Jesus remains in the Blessed Sacrament to give us the privilege of approaching him personally as so many people were able to do twothousand years ago in Galilee and Judea." (Fr. F. Racine). During Eucharistic Adoration, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent adoration.

HOW: Adorers are invited to meditate on Scripture or read devotional books, pray the rosary or another devotion. You may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. If you are interested, prayer, and reflection suggestions are available as starting points.

WHO: Jesus waits for us, each one of us, in the Eucharist. He waits when you are joyful, thankful, frustrated, or tired. All are welcome, including children. He specifically calls children to Himself, "Let the children come to me."

WHY: Since Apostolic times, Catholics rightly have gathered to celebrate Mass in community as Jesus instructed. Adoration provides an opportunity for an intimate relationship with Jesus through individual worship, prayer, and listening. Adoration is the "face-toface that leads to the "heart-to-heart" with Jesus.

WHEN: The next Eucharistic Adoration will be Thursday, October 17, 2019. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from 6:00pm-7:00pm. Come when you are able for as long as your schedule allows. Questions? Please contact Katie Kanzer @ k.f.kanzer@gmail.com.

October 6 Domestic Violence Outreach St. Francis Xavier, St. Cletus and St. John of the Cross



When we talk about domestic violence, just who and what are we discussing?

It is easy to put that "other" person over there, to feel sorry for her/him, to shun the abuser, to "tsk, tsk," about how it never used to be like this, to say "there but for the grace of God...", to stereotypically link her/him to poverty, drugs, under-education, or certain racial or ethnic groups.

Was she just a poor judge of men? Didn't she have any backbone? How could she let her children see that going on? Why didn't her family help her? Why didn't she just leave?

Unfortunately, interpersonal and intimate partner violence isn't so simple. During October, Domestic Violence month, this space will share with you some situations and some of the many faces of violence, so you can see for yourself how complicated it can be. As you read, please pay attention to the people as you picture them in your mind, to their appearance, their ethnicity - if you notice, to their general demeanor.

MYTH: Domestic Violence is bad, but it happens elsewhere. It doesn't happen in my community, my neighborhood, my culture, my religion, or my congregation.

FACT: Domestic Violence happens to people of every educational and socio-economic level. Domestic violence happens in all races, religions and age groups. Domestic Violence happens in both heterosexual and same-sex relationships.

STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

Your Parish Finance Report



Thanks for your patience while we finalized our budget for this fiscal year! Here's where we stand:

For Last Fiscal Year (ended June 30, 2019):

Total Collections were \$1,842,411, an increase of about \$19,000 (1%) from the previous fiscal year (ending June 30, 2018).

Last year, our parish had an <u>operating loss</u> of \$22,163. This loss was a result of capital improvement expenses associated with the return of our early childhood program from the space we rented from First Baptist Church (resulting in long-term saving), as well as higher than anticipated plumbing maintenance and snow removal expenses.


Our annual report will come out at the end of October with more details.

For the Current Fiscal Year (ending June 30, 2020):

Our budget has been approved. Annual collections budget has been set at \$1,876,000 (about 2% increase from last year's actual collections). The collections budget was set to break even with expenses. It is lower than budgets set in the past few years due to savings from the return of our Early Childhood students to our Education Building and lower priest expenses for the first six months of the fiscal year.

In preparing this year's budget, we have looked very closely at expenses and have managed them as tightly as possible without impacting our ability to fund vital ministries in our parish. This includes deferring the hiring of a pastoral associate to January 1. If our collections continue to fall short of budgeted goals, we will need to reassess each ministry and consider reductions in funding, which could limit our capacity to provide the experiences and opportunities which we as a parish desire and expect.

An Invitation to Spiritual Direction

What is it? Spiritual Direction is a way of appreciating and responding to your life's journey in the light of the Lord's life and love. As you grow physically, spiritually and emotionally, it is often helpful to talk with someone about how to integrate all of these experiences into a life of faith. A spiritual director is someone with experience and training who can be a companion or friend willing to listen and talk about your journey in all its joys and concerns.

Who goes? Perhaps you are experiencing a real spiritual hunger and want to explore ways of filling it. You may be asking yourself: "How is God real for me now?" or, "How is my faith meaningful for me in this situation? These are areas that suggest a spiritual companion (director) would be helpful. Other areas that might be the focus of conversation with a spiritual director (companion) include: questions about religion; the need for expanding your image of God; successes or failures in trying to live a more loving life; bringing the Lord into important decisions in your life; exploring moral dilemmas.

What happens? You enter into a conversation and trusting relationship in which the director (companion) helps you notice and respond to the movement of God as experienced in prayer and in the events of everyday life. The director acts primarily as a listener, as a supportive person who can help you look honestly at your relationship with God as it is lived out in everyday life. You are always the gatekeeper in terms of what you bring to spiritual direction and how much of yourself you share and reveal. Spiritual direction is not a therapy session, but a prayerful conversation designed to help you become more award of God's voice and to help you discover the best ways to respond to that voice.

How to begin? If you would like to respond to this invitation, you may call Mary Agnes Dwyer at 773-441-8151 so you can make an appointment. Your appointments can be scheduled at convenient intervals, monthly or every two or three weeks, whatever suites your needs at this time. Your meeting would be in a room in the rectory. Mary Agnes has training in spiritual direction and also has a Master of Theology Degree from the Catholic Theological Union. There is no fee.

As you begin spiritual direction or as some refer to this process, spiritual companioning, you may want to reflect on your own growth in prayer, where God fits into your joys and concerns of your life at this time, or whatever it is that you feel could help your relationship with God grow. "It is in God that we live, and move, and have our being."


