

# Pastor's Notes

"Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and found by those who seek her." Wisdom 6:12

Jesus calls his disciples to stay awake. His message is one of hope, not fear. He uses a parable of a wedding banquet for which the servants are preparing to celebrate when the groom arrives with his new bride. Since the wedding took place in another town, the servants do not know when the bridegroom will arrive. They must remain alert if they want to enter the wedding banquet upon their master's arrival. They must make choices that will help them to stay awake.

Wisdom is the Spirit that dwells within and among us to guide us toward choices that will keep us prepared to welcome the Lord when he comes. The Spirit of Wisdom does not hide from us; we need only seek her to find her. She is God's desire to be with us; a desire planted within our hearts. Wisdom opens our eyes to the needs of our sisters and brothers; wisdom calls us to respond in ways that build up the Body of Christ and so make us more prepared to recognize and welcome Christ in our midst. Wisdom inspires and gives vibrancy to our mission and ministries.

This week all registered parishioners should have received our Parish Annual Report. This year's report celebrates the contributions and time and talent to our mission and ministries, as well as providing a report of our financial status for the parish year that ended on June 30, 2017. We have much for which to be thankful in the past year, including the completion of Unity Hall and the renovation of Joyce Hall and the Gym. We continued to reach out to the hungry and homeless in our community, and to needs well beyond our parish borders. Members of the parish Finance Council are asking you to consider joining the over 300 of us who currently contribute financially to the parish through electronic giving. Take a brochure and stop by Unity Hall this weekend to learn how easy it is. And God bless all forms of your generosity to the parish.

Wisdom speaks through all of us. The Parish Prophetic Plan called for the increased participation of parishioners and development of parish leadership through an extension of the Parish Pastoral Council into four commissions that gather major areas of parish life and ministry. ALL parishioners are invited to the first all-commission gathering this Monday from 7-9 PM in Joyce Hall. A vibrant parish seeks out and listens to the wisdom of all parishioners. Whether currently serving as a leader of a ministry or parish organization, consider adding your voice to the parish conversation.

# **Scripture Reflection**

Having recently gotten engaged and starting to make plans for the wedding, this week's Gospel brings up some feelings of stress and anxiety, as half of those meant to meet the bridegroom were not prepared and they disastrously messed up their part to play in the whole affair. What if that happens at my own wedding? Will everything go according to plan and everyone be prepared?

This Sunday's Gospel can be summed up in those two words: be prepared. We don't know for sure the hour in which Jesus will come to us; the best we can do is wait in prayerful anticipation to be prepared when the moment arises. When our neighbor asks for an extra egg to finish their dinner preparations, when the man sitting on the sidewalk begs for help in buying a meal, when the woman is sitting alone in the pew at Mass, we must be prepared to answer the call of Christ to make the kingdom of God present.

# Pope Francis Wants To Hear From Young People!

To prepare for the upcoming international Synod on "Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment," the Holy Father wants <u>online feedback</u> from all youth and young adults, ages 16 to 29, from around the world, regardless of how active they are in the practice of the faith.

#### The online survey is open until November 30, 2017.

The results of the online survey will be part of the international listening process that will help Pope Francis and the world's bishops better understand the realities, hopes, and concerns of youth and young adults in preparation for the 2018 Synod.

### Christmas Eve Masses Schedule For Children in Church

This year, on Christmas Eve, we will once again celebrate 3:00 and 5:00 liturgies planned for children. Again, tickets will be issued to parishioners for these two masses. These tickets will be available in church on the Monday evening after Thanksgiving.

#### On Monday, November 27

- 1. Doors of church will open at 5:30 pm.
- 2. Know the Mass for which you want tickets. As you enter church, obtain a number for that Mass.
- 3. You will be asked to sit in numerical order, beginning with the last row in church.
- 4. At **6:00** a drawing will decide the first number that will be called for picking up tickets. Following the number decided by the drawing, all numbers after this first number will be called in consecutive order.
- 5. Anyone coming in after the beginning number is picked will be given a different set of numbers, which will be called numerically AFTER the initial numbers have been exhausted.

There is no need for anyone to arrive earlier than 5:30 pm. A drawing will decide the number that begins the distribution of tickets. The drawing will take place at 6:00 pm.

# Christmas Eve Masses at Motherhouse Chapel

Immediately after the distribution of tickets for 3:00 and 5:00 masses in church, taking place on November 27th, we will distribute the tickets for the Sisters of St. Joseph Chapel. This year you will only need tickets for the 3:00 mass at the Motherhouse.

Please arrive at church at 6:30 pm and we will follow the exact same procedure as above.

No need to arrive earlier than 6:30 pm, as distribution will begin at 6:45 pm.



#### The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Friday 9:00 am until 8:30 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.


# The Giving Tree


