



Pastor's Notes

There will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.

Malachi 3:20

How and when will the world as we know it come to an Poets, prophets, writers, scientists, philosophers all have offered their version of the "end of the world." The prophet Malachi speaks of a purifying fire that will destroy all that is evil, leaving neither root nor branch. For residents of much of California, this may be a terrifying image; one they have experienced too clearly in recent years. Most of us respect and may fear the destructive power of fire. Yet we often fail to realize its power to purify and renew. Forests rely upon fires to clear brush and other growth that can stifle the healthy growth of the strongest plants and trees. Without that "natural" rhythm, overgrowth both threatens the healthy trees and plants and provides fuel for potentially catastrophic fires. The spiritual challenge is for us to be ready and willing for that purifying fire that encourages growth so as to avoid the destructive fire that comes when we hold on to things too tightly and/or insist on keeping things "as they are" rather than surrendering to the natural rhythms of life on earth and in the Spirit.

There will come a day when the universe, or our planet, or life as we know it, or our individual lives will come to an end. Autumn time in our part of the world surrounds us with the images of the earth passing from green through a beautiful burst of color to the browns and grays

of winter. Yet in faith we view this as a time of transformation that will lead to new life. We plant the bulbs of tulips and daffodils before the ground freezes in hope of the spring thaw that will bring new color to the earth. We decorate our homes with bright lights to celebrate the light of Christ in the midst of winter's darkness. We acknowledge the sadness of the death of a loved one and the mixture of tears and joy that come with calling them to mind and heart. Yet we also celebrate their lives and give thanks for our connection with them as they, who gather at the banquet feast of heaven, surround <u>us</u> when we glimpse that feast around the altar of Eucharist.

Death is not the end of the story of faith. Scripture in these final weeks of the Church year confronts us with reminders that the world as we know it is only part of our journey and not our destiny. When life as we know it comes to its end, we will enter the fullness of life that now we only know by faith. We embrace the joys and sorrows of the present moment even as we look forward to the signs that the healing and purifying rays of the sun of justice, the Son of Justice, have begun to shine upon us.

CHRISTMAS EVE MASSES AT ALEXINE CHAPEL

On Christmas Eve, we will celebrate Masses at 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM at the Alexine Chapel (formerly the Motherhouse Chapel). We will <u>not</u> issue tickets for the 5:00 PM Mass. However, we need to respect the Chapel seating capacity of 800 persons. We have been able to accommodate everyone who has chosen to attend this Mass in recent years.

The 3:00 PM Mass continues to push us beyond the capacity of the Alexine Chapel. Therefore, we will return to the practice of issuing tickets for the 3:00 PM Mass only. We will distribute these tickets on Monday evening, December 2. Please tell your friends and others who plan to attend the 3:00 PM Christmas Eve Mass at the Alexine Chapel that admission will be by ticket only.

The procedure for obtaining tickets for this Mass:

- 1. Church doors will open on Monday, December 2 at 5:30 PM.
- 2. As you enter church, obtain a numbered stub from a volunteer.
- 3. Stubs will be given out in numerical order. You will be asked to sit in that same numerical order, beginning with the last row in church.
- 4. At 6:00 PM, a drawing will determine the numbered stub that begins the distribution process. We will proceed in numerical order from that point to the last stub given out at the door; then continuing with the first number given out as long as tickets remain.
- 5. If you arrive after 6:00 PM, you will receive a stub in a new series of numbers; these will be called AFTER all of the initial numbers have been called.

Please do not arrive earlier than 5:30 PM on December 2.

The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 8:30 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm; Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: November 16; January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.




Parish Counselor


