



Pastor's Notes

Let us give thanks to the Creator who has made us fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light. Colossians 1:12

Let us give thanks. Paul invites us to consciously practice the *virtue of gratitude*. I can become so caught up in what is yet to be accomplished or what remains in an uncertain future that I fail to pause and give thanks for the blessings of this <u>present</u> moment. *Gratitude must be practiced* and requires time and intention. My recent eight-day silent retreat offered an abundance of moments to be grateful for the beauty of a light snowfall blanketed the ground with a bejeweled sparkle in both sunlight and moonlight. I experienced gratitude for all the blessings of life and love, and a vocation that fills me and allows Christ's love to flow through me to others.

Let us give thanks. Each of us have worries, losses, or preoccupations that can inhibit our practice of gratitude. It may be something we have not yet achieved or something we have failed to achieve. It may be a difficult relationship or a resentment that we have not yet been able to shake. It may be the death or serious illness of a loved one. It may be current events such as war, poverty, or divisive politics that distract from service of the common good. Whatever it may be, this week invites us to *let it be* for a few days and *allow gratitude to dwell* in our hearts and homes.

Let us give thanks. This weekend we celebrate Christ as Lord of all Creation. We believe that *all was created* through the Son, the Word of God made flesh in Jesus. We believe that *all has been redeemed* by the sacrifice of Jesus, who speaks of God's mercy and unconditional love to a criminal at his side who shares the agony of crucifixion; a mercy more fully revealed in the resurrection, which proves to be the death of death. We believe that *all creation will find its fulfillment* when all is united in Christ at the end of time.

Let us give thanks. Our parish Food Pantry will supply the trimmings for a Thanksgiving dinner to area families through the generous donations of parishioners and the generous gift of time from the volunteers who will sort, bag, greet, and send forth with our blessing those who come to our door. Perhaps we could make time to be mindful of neighbors, family, or friends who will be alone this Thanksgiving Day, or who have lost a loved one within the past year. We might reach out to them through a phone call, an email, or a visit with a slice of pie. When we gather with family or friends, we might make a special effort to place a moratorium on politics at our tables and make a deliberate choice to focus our conversations on our relationships with those around us.

Let us give thanks. Join our parish Thanksgiving Mass at 10:00 AM this Thursday and give thanks for the blessings of God in our lives and in our shared mission.

Wherever you will be and with whomever you will share your time this Thursday, whether in person or through another form of greeting, *have a Blessed Thanksgiving*.

CHRISTMAS EVE MASSES FOR ALL AT ST. ALEXINE CHAPEL

On Christmas Eve, we again will celebrate Masses at 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM at the St. Alexine Chapel (formerly the Motherhouse Chapel). We will <u>not</u> issue tickets for the <u>5PM</u> Mass. We have been able to accommodate everyone who has chosen to attend this Mass in recent years.

However, we need to respect the St. Alexine Chapel seating capacity of 800 persons. Last year, we had to turn people away once we reached capacity. Therefore, we will return to the practice of issuing <u>tickets for the 3PM Mass only</u>. Tickets can be obtained on Monday evening, December 2nd. Please tell your friends and others who plan to attend the 3PM Christmas Eve Mass at St. Alexine Chapel that <u>they must obtain a ticket in</u> advance.

The procedure for obtaining tickets:

- 1. Church doors will open on Monday, December 2nd at 5:30 PM.
- 2. As you enter church, you will be given a numbered stub from a volunteer.
- 3. Stubs will be given out in numerical order. You will be asked to sit in that same numerical order, beginning with the last row in church.
- 4. At 6PM, a drawing will determine the numbered stub that begins the distribution process. We will proceed in numerical order from that point forward to the last stub given out at the door. We then will continue with the first number given out until all tickets have been distributed.
- 5. If you arrive after 6PM, you will receive a stub in a <u>new</u> series of numbers. These will be called AFTER all of the initial numbers have been called.

<u>Please do not arrive earlier than 5:30PM on</u> <u>December 2nd.</u>

CHRISTMAS EVE MASSES FOR YOUNGER CHILDREN AT PARISH CHURCH

On Christmas Eve, we celebrate two Masses in the church, at 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM, that are planned for families with <u>vounger</u> children. <u>Tickets will not be</u> <u>issued</u> for either of these Masses. We hope to accommodate everyone comfortably at each Mass. However, we advise everyone that the 3PM Mass in church usually exceeds church capacity (seats <u>and</u> allowable standing areas in the aisles and transepts). We broadcast each Mass into Unity Hall, which provides additional seating for approximately 80 persons and some additional standing room. Unity Hall also reaches capacity at the 3PM Mass.

Adults with no children or families with children who all are older than 2nd grade may want to consider the second Mass for children at 5PM or the 7PM Mass. Both have been able to seat all who come to celebrate the birth of Christ at those times. Please plan accordingly.

The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 8:30 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm; Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.

Children in Grades K–4 will be invited to join their Reflector in a prayer space away from the adults and to hear the Word of the Lord in words they can better understand on the following Saturdays (subject to change): December 14 & 21; January 11 & 18; February 15 & 22; March 7, 21 & 28; and April 28.


