

#### Pastor's Notes

Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord. Isaiah 2:5

And so, it begins.... A new church year in which the Gospel of Matthew will be our guide to the message and mission of Jesus. A new season of Advent, in which we reflect on Christ coming into our world: past, present, and future. A new time of preparations, decorations, and celebrations of the Word of God coming into our world as one like us and one among us. A new opportunity to gather with family and friends, to reconnect with those with whom we have not spoken in a while, and to mend broken relationships. A new moment to seek the light of Christ that always shines in the darkness, whatever form the darkness may take at this point in our lives. A new call to be the light of Christ for others who walk in darkness at this moment in their lives.

Advent leads us into the darkest days of the year. Like our ancestors before us, we counter the darkness with light. Some cultures did this with huge bonfires and torchlit processions. In our day, we decorate our homes, inside and out, with bright lights and ornaments that reflect that light. And as a people of faith, we focus on the light that is Christ shining in the darkness. Our German Lutheran ancestors give us the tradition of lighting a new candle on each of the four Sundays of the season. Our Filipino ancestors offer the parol, or star lantern, that lights the front window of the home on the final nine days of the season. Our Latin American ancestors offer the pinata, a star with seven points that represent the seven deadly sins, whose destruction causes sweetness of hidden candies to burst forth in joyful light. Trees are adorned with lights that replace what once were candles reminding us of the light of Christ given us at Baptism.

Where do we find the light of Christ this Advent: in our lives, our homes, our community, our nation, and our world? How is Christ seeking to be known as he comes to us in the darkness of this moment? Who, what, or where is the light of Christ that desires to lead us to the joy and peace of a new Christmas?

Come, my friends. Let us walk in the light of the Lord. Let us encourage one another as we discover the light of Christ in the darkness and prepare to celebrate the birth of God's light in a Child become Savior whose light will never leave us.

There will be NO 6PM MASS on Sunday, December 29th. Please make plans accordingly.

#### CHRISTMAS EVE MASSES FOR ALL AT ST. ALEXINE CHAPEL

On Christmas Eve, we again will celebrate Masses at 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM at the St. Alexine Chapel (formerly the Motherhouse Chapel). We will <u>not</u> issue tickets for the <u>5PM</u> Mass. We have been able to accommodate everyone who has chosen to attend this Mass in recent years.

However, we need to respect the St. Alexine Chapel seating capacity of 800 persons. Last year, we had to turn people away once we reached capacity. Therefore, we will return to the practice of issuing tickets for the 3PM Mass only. Tickets can be obtained on Monday evening, December 2nd. Please tell your friends and others who plan to attend the 3PM Christmas Eve Mass at St. Alexine Chapel that they must obtain a ticket in advance.

The procedure for obtaining tickets:

- 1. Church doors will open on Monday, December 2nd at 5:30 PM.
- 2. As you enter church, you will be given a numbered stub from a volunteer.
- 3. Stubs will be given out in numerical order. You will be asked to sit in that same numerical order, beginning with the last row in church.
- 4. At 6PM, a drawing will determine the numbered stub that begins the distribution process. We will proceed in numerical order from that point forward to the last stub given out at the door. We then will continue with the first number given out until all tickets have been distributed.
- 5. If you arrive after 6PM, you will receive a stub in a <u>new</u> series of numbers. These will be called AFTER all of the initial numbers have been called.

## Please do not arrive earlier than 5:30PM on December 2nd.

#### CHRISTMAS EVE MASSES FOR YOUNGER CHILDREN AT PARISH CHURCH

On Christmas Eve, we celebrate two Masses in the church, at 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM, that are planned for families with younger children. Tickets will not be issued for either of these Masses. We hope to accommodate everyone comfortably at each Mass However, we advise everyone that the 3PM Mass in church usually exceeds church capacity (seats and allowable standing areas in the aisles and transepts). We broadcast each Mass into Unity Hall, which provides additional seating for approximately 80 persons and some additional standing room. This room also reaches capacity at the 3PM Mass.

Adults with no children or families with children who all are older than 2nd grade may want to consider the second Mass for children at 5PM or the 7PM Mass. Both have been able to seat all who come to celebrate the birth of Christ. At those times. Please plan accordingly.

#### The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 8:30 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm; Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

## Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten-Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflector of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer AND when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing and when a specific grade is not scheduled to celebrate liturgy at the 5:00 Mass.

Here is the tentative schedule with the children's choirs: January 25; February 29; March 14.

Here is the schedule when a Grade Level Mass is celebrated: February 1 & 8; April 18.

Children in Grades K–4 will be invited to join their Reflector in a prayer space away from the adults and to hear the Word of the Lord in words they can better understand on the following Saturdays (subject to change): December 14 & 21; January 11 & 18; February 15 & 22; March 7, 21 & 28; and April 28.



## Christian Meditation at St. John of the Cross

"To learn to meditate, you have to learn to be silent, and not to be afraid of silence. [W]e don't have to create silence. The silence is there, within you. What we have to do is to enter into it, to become silent, to become the silence. The challenge of meditation is to allow ourselves to become silent enough to allow this interior silence to emerge. Silence is the language of the spirit. The language of the spirit is love. And the purpose of meditation is to be in the presence of love, the love that, as Jesus tells us, casts out all fear."

One of the meditators said she notices a difference in how she experiences Mass-- "I feel like I am really hearing the words and teachings for the first time and they are making sense, connecting me to my humanity and to God in each person around me."

#### **How To Meditate**

Sit still and upright in a quiet place with feet flat on the floor and hands in lap or on knees.

Let go of any expectations or demands. Just Be.

Gently close your eyes and silently, interiorly begin To say a single prayer word. The word recommended is Ma-ra-na-tha (Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke), meaning "Come, Lord".

Continue repeating the word during the entire time of meditation. Whenever distractions come, gently return your attention to the word, without judging or analyzing. It is recommended to meditate 20-30 minutes twice a day.

All are welcome to any of the 4 weekly groups for Christian Meditation in the Parish Center, room 7.

Meetings last 45 to 55 minutes, and no experience is necessary.

Want peace and joy during the Advent Season? Come join us for Eucharistic Adoration! December 19, 2019 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: During Adoration, sometimes referred to as a Holy Hour (but can be of any duration), the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent Adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. St. John Paul II offered that "our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete."

**HOW**: Adorers are invited to pray a rosary or other devotions, meditate on Scripture or meditate on devotional books. Adorers may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. If you are interested, prayer and reflection suggestions are available as starting points.

When we come to the Blessed Sacrament we come to Bethlehem, a name which means "house of bread." Jesus chose to be born in Bethlehem because He would dwell with us forever as the "Living Bread" come down from heaven. When the shepherds and Magi came to adore Him, they brought Him so much joy with their humble visit to Bethlehem that their visit has been praised and retold down through the centuries. .... [Y]our humble visit to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament brings Him so much joy that it will be retold for all eternity and bring the world closer to His promise of peace on earth.


