#### Pastor's Notes

"What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!'"
Mark 13:37

Advent has only 22 days this year. For those of us with busy schedules and long lists of things to do, there will not seem to be enough days. For those of us who live in anticipation of Christmas morning, there will seem to be too many days. For all of us, there will be 22 days. How we experience them is a matter of mind and heart.

Jesus challenges us to remain alert and watchful: not in fear, but so that we may recognize the Lord when he appears among us and be ready to *celebrate* his presence. Perhaps children are the best ones to lead us into an Advent attitude. They do not live in fear that all will not be ready; they do not expect to be disappointed when Christmas arrives. They live in anticipation and joy of what they believe they will discover on Christmas morning. Their wonder invites us to let go of that which burdens us and to allow ourselves to experience the mystery of Emmanuel, God with us. The Word was a child born in a Bethlehem stable when God first became one like us. The Word continues to take flesh in the people and events of even the most ordinary of days. And the Word will come one day to lead us into a banquet feast beyond our dreams. We need only watch with attentive eyes, ears, and hearts as we engage with one another and those beyond our community.

This Sunday, we celebrate the feast day of our patron, St. Francis of Xavier, a missionary who went out with others to bring light to the world through the message of Jesus. The children of our parish elementary school did the same this past Friday as they served people specific to the service focus of their respective grade. Our religious education students have collected toys for the children of the St. Agatha community in Chicago. Our high school youth invite us this weekend to take a tag and support a family or organization in need. Last week our Food Pantry volunteers fed 125 households; those at the Thanksgiving Day Mass contributed over \$1,300 to an interfaith group that serves immigrants living in local detention centers through prayer, advocacy, and caring support. In all of this, Jesus asks us to be watchful, to be alert; to recognize his presence in each person even as he or she meets Christ in me.

Daily Mass goers please note. I will be away this week, and we could not find enough available priests to cover the regular weekday Mass schedule. One of the Masses on Monday through Wednesday, and the regular Mass on Thursday will be celebrated as a Communion service. To allow our maintenance staff to replace bulbs in the sanctuary, some of these Masses and services will move to Unity Hall. We appreciate your patience and flexibility.

Reflection for the First Sunday of Advent Liturgy Planning Team #4 Marci Hermesdorf, OP, Diane Walsh, and ShirleyAugustyn

In the gospel for the first Sunday of Advent Jesus uses the word "watch" four times. Just as we can hear but not listen, we can also see but not watch – not be alert or attentive. We are told to watch for the Lord's coming not knowing precisely the time or place. But we will encounter Jesus not only at the end of our lives, but we will meet him daily in people, places, and situations. Are we watchful for those times? Are we attentive to the times we meet Jesus in our families, our schools, our places of work – in friends and strangers alike? Do we look for ways to lighten the burdens of others? As we move through Advent let us watch for opportunities to act with kindness, generosity, and love.





#### Children's Liturgy of the Word

The Word of the Lord has a message for children as well as adults. Children's Liturgy of the Word offers the children an experience to hear the scripture in words that they can understand. Here at St. Francis we are fortunate and proud to have adult volunteers and Presiders of Liturgy who journey with our children so that they can experience the Word of the Lord with a message that is relevant and fitting for them.

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm. Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten—Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflectors of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word "kicked off" the school year on Saturday, October 14. Allen Sterwalt, our Director of Music, along with our Cherub Choir and SF Choristers (Children in Grades 1-8) led us in prayer with music. Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate to a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing.

## St. Francis Xavier Information about Our Patron Saint

"The dangers to which I am exposed and the tasks I undertake for God are springs of spiritual joy, so much so that these islands are the places in all the world for a man to lose his sight by excess of weeping; but they are tears of joy."

- · Born 1506, in Navarre, Spain.
- · Educated at the Univ. of Paris in the 1530s, where he met Ignatius of Loyola.
- · In 1541, was appointed apostolic nuncio (an ambassador of the Church) to Asia, and left for Portuguese Goa. The voyage took 15 months.
- · In his parting letter to Ignatius, he wrote: *'For what is left of this life, I am well assured, it will be by letter only that we shall be together in the other we shall embrace face to face.''*
- · Through his preaching he won many conversions, almost all among poor, tribal, and lower-caste peoples.
- · In his travels, he tended to the needs of the sick and infirm, revitalized the liturgical and sacramental life of already existing Christian populations, and drew people to faith in Jesus Christ.
- · In 1546, he explored other islands in southern Asia. Then, in 1549, he moved on to Japan, where he made a hundred converts in a year at Kagoshima. By the time he left three years later, there were 2,000 Japanese Christians.
- · In 1552, Francis left for mission work in China. He became ill on the way, and died almost alone on the island of Shang-chwan, six miles off the coast of mainland China.
- · His death was on December 3, 1552 at the age of forty-six.
- · St. Francis Xavier remains one of the greatest missionaries in the history of the Church.
- · He was canonized in 1622, along with Ignatius of Loyola, Teresa of Avila, and Philip Neri.
- · In 1927 he was declared the patron saint of foreign missions.

We pray: Make me your faithful follower, Lord Jesus, as was Saint Francis Xavier.

May others hear and see you through me. I pray through Christ our Lord, Amen.

#### The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Friday 9:00 am until 8:30 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

The CD is available for purchase at St. Francis Xavier for the holidays! The cost is \$15 per two-CD set; or buy




multiple copies for holiday gifts and receive a discount. Proceeds will help support a community outreach organization, and the SFX Music Ministry.




