

Pastor's Notes

"Comfort, give comfort to my people. Speak tenderly." Isaiah 40:1, 2

Tuesday is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. It marks the last of four appearances of the Virgin Mary to Juan Diego, a poor man of mixed blood. Over several days, Mary appears to Juan Diego and asks him to announce to the bishop God's desire that a church be built on that spot. The bishop is skeptical, and Juan Diego is distracted by his care for a sick uncle; but Mary persists. On the fourth day, December 12th, Mary asks Juan Diego to gather the roses of many colors and varieties that have bloomed on the hillside into his tilma (cloak), and to bring these to the bishop as the sign that he has requested. When Juan Diego opens the tilma and the roses fall to the floor, the image of Mary as she appeared to Juan Diego is revealed. For 486 years, this tilma has been honored by the people of Mexico as a sign of God's love and mercy.

The image is of a style and of colors not known to artists in Europe or the Americas at the time. Although now under bullet-proof, light-protective glass, it has survived the elements, fire, physical attack, and the touch of thousands of believers. Most importantly, Mary's appearance (the style of her clothing, her pregnancy, and the symbols on and around her) led the indigenous people to understand the Franciscan teachings about Jesus. A massive conversion of the indigenous people occurred in the months following her appearance; this prevented the genocide that the conquistadors were about to initiate with the blessing of the King of Spain. The *church* that Mary asked to be built indeed came into being. But not simply the structures that have been built over time on and around the hill of Tepevac. More importantly, church was built in the Americas as God brought together the indigenous, Spanish, and mestizo (mixed blood) peoples. God's people in the Americas were to be a people of *many* races and languages and cultures. We would be challenged constantly to comfort all those most in need among us: to speak tenderly to those whose dignity might be challenged by the structures or attitudes of civil society. Mary called for the justice that is at the heart of the Advent call of the prophets.

May this Advent deepen our commitment to work for justice among all peoples.

We can sometimes have a warped perception of God, that He is out to get us! That He is a fire and brimstone God, ready to pounce on us for all the wrongs we have done. Our sense of guilt keeps us even farther away from getting to know God for who He truly is. But we should see not only God's judgment but also His love. We have to realize that we serve a God who knows what is good for us, and so calls us to holiness. He is the same God who is "patient" with us, "not wishing that any should perish."

God sent the prophet Isaiah to "speak tenderly" and to give "comfort" to the people, reminding them that their "guilt is expiated." It is also a message for all of us now, during our special Advent journey. When we realize that our Father is like the shepherd, who "feeds his flock," "gathers the lambs in His arms," "carrying them in his bosom," it should put our hearts at ease as we seek to follow Him. He is a true Father, who doesn't stop seeking out His children no matter how far away they are, or how many times they reject Him.

God's mercy should however not be mistaken for an excuse to continue in sin. He calls us to conduct ourselves "in holiness and devotion," as we wait for the "coming of the day of God." We are to "prepare the way of the Lord," and to be part of Christ's redeeming work in a "rugged" world that sometimes seems so far from its Creator. Let us press on to fulfill the call of our baptism, to be all God wants us to be, knowing who we are: beloved children of the most high God! That is comfort!

AN UPDATE ON OUR PARISH FINANCES

God bless you for your stewardship! During this month of Advent, we are reminded of the generosity of those in the past who have celebrated Christmas Day at St. Francis Xavier Parish. You may have received an email this past week about signing up for electronic giving using your credit card or bank account. Children's Liturgy of the Word

The Word of the Lord has a message for children as well as adults. Children's Liturgy of the Word offers the children an experience to hear the scripture in words that they can understand. Here at St. Francis we are fortunate and proud to have adult volunteers and Presiders of Liturgy who journey with our children so that they can experience the Word of the Lord with a message that is relevant and fitting for them.

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm. Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten— Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflectors of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word "kicked off" the school year on Saturday, October 14. Allen Sterwalt, our Director of Music, along with our Cherub Choir and SF Choristers (Children in Grades 1-8) led us in prayer with music. **Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer.** The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate to a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing.

The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Friday 9:00 am until 8:30 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.



The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.





Looking for a rewarding opportunity to make a difference in your community?


The AARP Tax-Aide Program is now seeking volunteers for the upcoming 2018 filing season. It's not necessary for you to be an AARP member nor have a tax or an accounting background to volunteer. However, some knowledge of your own personal tax matters is very helpful. All returns are prepared on computers, thus volunteers should be somewhat computer literate. Training classes will be held in January, 2018. Minimum time commitment during the filing season is 4 to 5 hours one day per week from early February to mid April. This income tax preparation and assistance is offered to low and middle income individuals with special attention to those 60 years and older.


