

Pastor's Notes

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth. to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. Luke 1:26-27

Luke deliberately places the Annunciation of the birth of Jesus in a specific context. God is sending God's messenger, to be sure. But the angel is sent to Galilee, far from Jerusalem and suspect in its purity of religion due to intermarriage with foreigners. Instead of a major commercial town of Galilee, such as the fishing village of Capernaum, the angel is sent to Nazareth. The announcement of this birth will come to the house of David, as the ancient prophecies foretold. But it will be to the betrothed of a carpenter, a tradesman, living an honest but hard life far from David's royal city of Bethlehem. And she will be of such little note that the last thing to be mentioned is her name, Mary.

Luke wants us to know that, from the beginning, the Son of God came into our world in simple, unexpected ways. Those who would look for him in a palace or in the home of a religious or civil authority of high renown would be sleeping and unaware on the night of his birth. It would be shepherds in the cold and dark of hillsides distant from the town who would hear the angels who announced this birth and sent them to the manger outside of Bethlehem. The first celebration of Christmas would not involve fancy clothes or plush surroundings. It would take place in a cave designed to shelter the livestock, visitors in sheep-smelling garments not newly washed, to see an infant lying on the straw of a rough manger.

Where do we look for the Christ Child in these final days of Advent? We are invited to look beneath the bright lights and wonderful aromas and fine clothing, as wonderful as these will be. We are invited to unite ourselves with the shepherds of our day – those on the outskirts of society, often forced to find their way through the shadows of hunger, fear, or illness. We are invited to open our hearts to the infant in the straw and not be distracted by the king on the throne. We are invited to a cave on the outskirts of town where God's light shines brightly for all who will let it into their lives.

We will not be a people of crowded Masses this year. Most will come to the cave via digital livestream rather than arriving in person. Those of us in the church, gym, or Joyce Hall will hum rather than sing the carols of Christmas. Nonetheless, we will come together in communion. If we open our hearts, we will hear the song of the angels and gaze with wonder on the Light that dispels the power of darkness. And, like the first shepherds, we will bring the Good News of this birth and the warmth of his Light, to all who will receive it. For that is what disciples of Jesus do.

Fourth Sunday of Advent Reflection Liturgy Team #3 David Sherman, Barbara Kalnes, Charles Brewick, Gertrude Nalumansi, and George Rutkowski

In the old testament Samuel tells us that God reminds David, and us all, that he will always be watching over his people and that in the fullness of time the messiah, the son of God, will come from his people. To what extent are we available to God and do we see what he wants to do in us and through us?

Scripture gives us the marvellous example of Mary. Even if she did not see clearly all it implied, Luke is telling us that even Mary who bore Jesus in her womb found it difficult to comprehend and accept what God might be doing and that the reality is that any encounter with God can lead us into confusion and questioning, "How can this be We too may have been troubled by events in our own lives and knowing that God is always present in our lives we accept what God has plans for us.

In Mary's willingness to say yes to God, she reveals great trust that God will provide what she needs to accomplish her role in this miraculous journey. The angel assures her, "Do not be afraid. Do not fear, Mary, for God is with you." We are reminded that with God everything is possible.

Like Mary, we too may be troubled by the uncertainty of the future yet Mary accepted her mission to become the mother of the Savior. We too have to say yes to God and to his plans with us and with the world. The story of the annunciation is *our* story – the story of *our* confusion and disbelief when God appears. Yet it is also the story of God's faithfulness and immeasurable love revealed in the Good news. With Mary as our model, we, too, learn to open our hearts to welcome the divine so that God's holy presence may take root and dwell in us.

In today's world there is a vital connection between Mary, God's beloved son Jesus, and the many essential workers who serve the world during these challenging Covid-19 times. They are the ones who extend their abilities, knowledge, and trust in loving service to others. Imagine Mary and Jesus alive within their hearts as these dedicated workers commit to God's call: "I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done to me according to God's will."



SAFE AND SOBER HOLIDAYS

Did you know that 10-13% of all the people in any community live with the disease of alcoholism or other chemical dependence? This includes 10-13% of our parish community. Each person who lives with a chemically dependent person also has a disease that negatively affects the lives of at least four other persons. 40% of the members of any community, including ours, know someone, or are concerned about someone, or are angry at someone who lives with this progressive and potentially fatal disease. The past nine months of living within pandemic restrictions has intensified this situation in many households.


If you care about someone who has a drinking or other drug problem, I encourage you to get help <u>for yourself</u>. Go to ALANON if you are affected by someone's chemical dependency. Go to FAMILIES ANONYMOUS if you are the relative or friend of a young person with drug or behavioral problems. Go to ADULT CHILDREN OF ALCOHOLICS if you are the adult child of someone with an alcohol or other drug problem. Get help for yourself before you attempt to intervene in the life of someone who is addicted. This is the best gift you can give to someone who is dependent on alcohol or another drug.
